#### A letter from the Revd. Canon Alyson Davie

#### What did happen between Good Friday and Easter Sunday?

This year the Christian Church celebrates Easter Sunday on 20 April. At the heart of Easter is the resurrection of Jesus. The earliest account of Jesus' resurrection can be found in the gospel of Matthew and his account contains a paradox.

In Matthew chapter 27 and verses 51-53 the death of Jesus on the cross is immediately followed by the breaking open of the tombs of the dead saints in Jerusalem. The holy dead rise from their tombs because in the death of Jesus, death itself has been slain as a result of his perfect self-sacrificing obedience to his Father's will.

However, this victory is only truly demonstrated when Jesus himself is raised from the tomb in chapter 28 verses I-I0. This is significant for us because we too live in an 'in between time'.

Death has been defeated by Jesus Christ, and like the dead saints in Jerusalem we have been rescued from the power of death as a result, but we will only truly see the truth of this when Jesus Christ returns in glory at the end of time and the bodies of the dead are raised.

In this 'in between time,' which Christians recall on Holy Saturday (the name traditionally given to the day between Good Friday and Easter Sunday) it might appear that nothing is happening, just as it might seem that nothing of significance happens in Matthew's gospel between Jesus' death and resurrection.

However, in Matthew something significant does happen because the stories of the women, of Joseph of Arimathea and the setting of a guard at the tomb, all point forward to the truth of the resurrection.

The women and Joseph are all witnesses that Jesus is truly dead and buried and the setting of a guard is a way of preventing anyone stealing the body. This sets the scene for what comes later by emphasising that what takes place on Easter Sunday is the miraculous return to life of the Jesus who was really dead.

We live in a world where many think that there is nothing after death. Death can be postponed but not defeated.

However, the story that Matthew tells is that God will step into that situation and bring the dead (including us) fully back to life at the end of time, just as he brought the dead Jesus fully back to life on Easter Sunday. That gives each one of us hope for the future both in this world and beyond.

It certainly did for Jesus' followers who had been heartbroken about his death, but who on Sunday morning at the tomb heard this message from the angels.

'He is not here; he has risen, just as he said'. Matthew chapter 28 verse 6, and that leads us to what we celebrate as Christians on Easter Sunday. A risen Saviour who has defeated death and thus made it possible, when we die, for us to be with him forever.


#### North Kent Embroiderers

Hello everyone, we had two mini workshops on offer at our last meeting. The first one was to learn about Hardanger embroidery with Veronica and the second one was trying the art of beading with Sue D. Hardanger embroidery is a style that is traditionally used in Norway (although it is said to originate

in Asia). It is worked on an evenweave cotton or linen fabric, usually using white thread. The technique involves counting the threads and stitching to form a pattern as well as cutting some of the threads away as you can see in this example. Cutting the threads requires bravery and concentration is



required to ensure that the pattern works successfully! Those doing beading were taught by Sue how to make an 'amulet purse'. This is a small intricately patterned purse, traditionally worn round the neck and used to carry small personal items such as charms or herbs. These purses are believed to give spiritual protection to the wearer. The members doing this class needed to be very dextrous as the purses and the beads are very tiny, however the developing beadwork looked beautiful. Our mini workshops last all day but those not taking part joined us at our usual time in the afternoon to 'stitch and chat' bringing their own projects along to work on or to ask for advice with. It was lovely to have new visitors joining us. In early February seven members of our group visited Scotney Castle. They went to meet a lady called Ellen Askey James who works there and is currently involved in a project to conserve em-



broideries in The Red Room. Our ladies had a fascinating time helping Ellen with her research and learning how restoration and conservation is done in historic houses.

The theme for our postcard challenge this month was 'monochrome' and you can see one of the examples here. It was interesting to see how many ways the term 'monochrome' could be interpreted from simple black and white to a range of shades of a single colour.



#### **BELL RINGING by Peter Hartley**

The Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme has introduced many thousands of youngsters to new interests and two are with us in the Cobham church tower. Bell ringing can be taken to any level and ringers continue to learn the art and science of bell ringing as they pursue their hobby. We are all learners, if not as able in my eighties.

So what goes on in the Cobham, and any, church tower? Our medieval tower, the work of the King's master mason Henry Yevele, is firm and robust. It is entered by an external door and after climbing up the 36 stone steps of the spiral stair you reach the ringing room.

In the ringing room hang our 6 ropes each with their green, yellow and white woollen 'sally'. The ropes hang in a circle. In the room above, the bell chamber, are our 6 bells four of which are  $17^{th}$  century. The bells are hung on a 1994 steel frame. Each bell has a big wheel to which the bell rope is attached. Also there is a wooden stay and slider mechanism, explanation to follow.

Bells hang safely in the down position with their mouths facing downwards. To ring the first, tricky, task is to raise the bells by pulling on the ropes and with the leverage of the wheels the bells are finally facing upwards with their mouths up and the stay resting against the slider to prevent the bell going right over.

The first task of the teacher is to help the learner to achieve correct and skilled rope handling for then bell control is mastered and good striking results. Outside clean striking is the most significant sound heard. By control of the rope the bell is pulled off the balance, handstroke, and swings through 360° and then with backstroke back to its original position having sounded twice. Bell handling takes a while to master but once achieved, like cycling, it is a skill never forgotten and can be returned to at any time in life.

Bell ringing always starts with rounds and ends with rounds. That is each of the six ringers pull their bell off the balance in order — I, the lightest bell always called the treble, 2, 3, 4, 5, and finally 6, the heaviest and deepest sounding and always called the tenor (ours weighs I3 cwt). The order 'stand' is given and the bells are carefully settled in the up position with the stay resting gently against the slider.

Perhaps time for a rest from this practice session. The bells, probably in peal and not easy, are lowered and left in the safe position with their mouths facing downwards. Down the spiral stair and out into the churchyard. The snowdrops are over and the daffodils coming. Spring is on the way.




