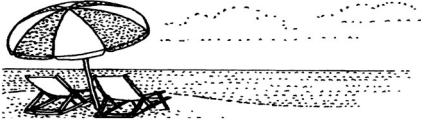

A letter from the vicar

Dear Friends,

'You're more than a number.' That was a clever slogan BT came up with some years ago, but I found it hard to believe then and even harder now. When you deal with an organisation of any size these days your name is seldom of much use or interest to them – they're unable to do anything for you until you come up with a number

It's sometimes quite hard to work out which number is the one they need. The big number across the middle? The product number? The serial number? Your account number? The invoice number? Your customer reference number? The number at the bottom of the address label?... Or the one at the top?

To be fair, modern computer systems, which of course are the reason for this number-hunger, do give a much improved and speedier service. But you have to play it their way; and we all know that when The system is down, no business can be done, no appointments made, and no queries answered... It's all or nothing. I'm not fooled by those fake 'personalised letters': They're entirely mechanical, of course. The printed signature always gives them away.

The height - or rather the depth - of impersonality was an experience I had in a local housing office a number of years ago. At no point did the clerk ask my name and before it was my turn I heard her on the phone saying, "I've got (52 Woods Rd) here referring to the gentleman standing in front of me in the queue.

Is there anything we can do about it? Probably very little beyond trying to set a good example by using people's names ourselves. I try to do this with people I talk to and if I can't remember their name I ask them what their name is. It's better to always know what a person's name is.

But what I'm so thankful for is that to God every one of us really does matter. We are all names to him even though he's got far more people in his database than the largest PLC.

The part of the Bible that brings this home to me more than any other is Psalm 139. Do read it sometime. We're told there that God knows what we're doing, what we're thinking, where we've been and where we're going. He knew us even before we were born, for indeed he formed us in the womb. His is the most perfect knowledge imaginable. All that would be pretty scary, even terrifying, if we did not also know that God's love towards us is just as perfect.

When I feel numberised and belittled, I can be heartened as I remember that to God our Father who loves his children and knows them by name as to him each one of us is special and unique. To God, the God who created us and loves us, you are certainly not a number.

The hot weather during June encouraged the Craft Group to continue working on the memory quilt to progress their individual patchwork pieces at home but we are resuming assembly on Wednesday afternoons in the St Mary's Church Room.

One of our speakers had to cancel but we were delighted that we were able to secure at short notice the team from "Fancy Tat" who gave us a talk on creating new & practical products by upcycling pre-loved and neglected stuff. We were shown how to salvage unwanted objects from unique or limited materials like old vinyl records and turn them into a fruit bowl or tiered cake-stand so they could be re-used. We had a demonstration on how to cut old glass bottles and upcycle into a storm lantern base and ornamental bell. Old computer discs were revamped into storage pots; used bottle tops into novelty cufflinks. We all soon recognised the potential in everyday objects and the benefit to the environment of creative recycling instead of discarding.

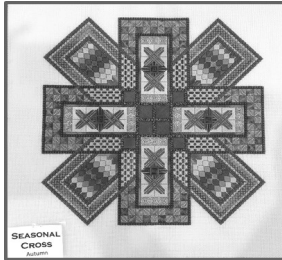

Hello Everyone,

Our last meeting was well attended despite the roadworks in Dale Road which did their best to confuse some of us!



We welcomed our speaker Nikki Fairhurst www.needleworkbynikki.co.uk who told us about her needleworking journey which she entitled 'out of adversity comes opportunity' Nikki told us how she came from a family of stitchers. As a child she learnt how to sew and to make her own clothes to the amazement of her teacher at school who thought her mother had done Nikki's stitching for her. After school Nikki trained as a community

pharmacist and worked as such for many years until a stroke of adversity caused her to rethink this. She took some time out and began to develop her kits which she now sells online.

Nikki loves all sorts of techniques, basically anything which involves a needle and thread. Her skills cover goldwork, crewelwork, canvaswork, quilting, ribbon embroidery, bead embroidery, Mountmellick (a style of floral white-work embroidery) etc. etc.

More recently she has been training at the Royal School of Needlework on their 'Future Tutors' programme where she received an award for being top student and in 2023 she was invited to be part of the Embroidery Studio team at the RSN who worked on a number of items for the Coronation of Their Majesties King Charles III and Queen Camilla.

Nikki's story was truly an inspiration showing how, with determination she succeeded in turning her hobby into a fulfilling career.

BELL RINGING by Peter Hartley

Having advised The King of the Cobham bells celebration of the Coronation we ringers have now received a letter and card from Buckingham Palace. The printed card is decorated with the attractive border of illustrations of nature used on the Coronation Invitations. It has a photograph of Their Majesties crowned, together with a printed message and the signatures of The King and Queen. Also included was a letter which says –

‘The King has asked me to thank you for your letter in which you shared the news of the ringing and changes that were carried out in honour of Their Majesties’ Coronation on Saturday, 6th May.

It heartened The King to hear that all the bell ringers of St. Mary Magdalene Church participated in general ringing and changes in honour of this special day. His Majesty was especially touched to learn that a quarter peal of Grandsires Doubles rang on Sunday, 7th May, in further loyal support for The King and The Queen.

Thank you, once again, for taking the time to write to His Majesty, who would have me convey his warmest thanks and good wishes to you all.’

We bell ringers enjoy keeping the ringing tradition going despite the decline in parish worship. We ring for Coronations and family occasions as requested. This year I have rung at a Shorne funeral for a ringer and at Meopham for Mary Bagshawe’s Thanksgiving Service. Church Weddings are infrequent these days but so far in 2023 I have rung at Cliffe and Meopham Weddings. I am booked to ring at three Weddings at Milton-next-Gravesend and the happy news is that a Cobham Wedding approaches.

Always ready to turn to Charles Dickens I rejoice in the account of the Wedding of Little Dorrit and Arthur Clennam –

‘They all gave place when the signing was done, and Little Dorrit and her husband walked out of the church alone. They paused for a moment on the steps of the portico, looking at the fresh perspective of the street in the autumn morning sun’s bright rays, and then went down.

Went down into a modest life of usefulness and happiness.

They went quietly down into the roaring streets, inseparable and blessed; and as they passed along in sunshine and shade, the noisy and the eager, and the arrogant and the forward and the vain, fretted and chafed, and made their usual uproar.’

That marvellous Higham author describes that magical moment when every bride and groom walks out of the church into the world as husband and wife with all joy and hope. High up in the church tower this ringer pulls his bell rope and we band of ringers peal the bells with more joy sending the happy couple on their way in love into the future.

Our June meeting saw the return of Stuart Robinson, who gave the second part of his fascinating and informative talk about “Curiosities of the City of London”. We learned, for instance, how the square mile was founded by the Romans and he showed us pictures of the London Stone – the oldest relic in the city, which could be over a thousand years old. He told us how in 1450 Jack Cade, who took part in a peasant’s revolt, struck the stone with his sword and appointed himself Mayor and how the revolt had ended in a bloody battle on London Bridge. We also saw how streets had changed their names (e.g. Candlewick Street became Canon Street) and how different shop signs had been used to make it clear to illiterate people exactly what businesses were carried out there, such as the three balls of the pawnbroker’s sign and the red and white stripes on the barbers’ poles.

July saw one of the highlights of our year, when the committee members act as hostesses for our annual strawberry tea. A good time was had by all, with, in addition to delicious strawberries from Broadditch Farm Shop, we enjoyed home made cakes and scones, including Jean Horgan’s now legendary fresh cream meringues and the ladies who were at the table that scored most points in the quiz received Smarties as a prize, because they were! We were delighted to see so many of our members and visitors.

Two lucky members won bursaries, which are awarded each year, and last year’s winners were there to tell us how they had used theirs.

We do not have a meeting in August, although some of our ‘groups’ will continue to meet at various venues. Our next meeting will therefore be at 2pm on Wednesday 6th September in The Meadow Room, when Sue Cameron will be giving a talk entitled “Magic of the Pyjama Fairies”. Visitors are always welcome at our meetings and there will only be a small charge to cover the cost of refreshments. We meet on the first Wednesday of each month, except August.

- 3 Deadhead flowering plants regularly
- 4 Watering! - particularly containers, and new plants, preferably with grey recycled water or stored rainwater
- 5 Collect seed from favourite plants
- 6 Harvest sweetcorn and other vegetables as they become ready
- 7 Continue cutting out old fruited canes on raspberries
- 8 Lift and pot up rooted strawberry runners
- 9 Keep ponds and water features topped up
- 10 Feed the soil with green manures

Gardening for a Wilder Kent – Trees and Logs



We are lucky here to have a good number of large trees, trees that were here before we were born and if left alone will be here after we have gone and even future generations. We visit their kingdom for a short while and they tolerate us. We need to treat them with the respect they deserve. There are some trees around that are protected by law, but many are not. Their part in adding oxygen to the atmosphere is huge and taken for granted. Please do not think you can cut down a large tree in your garden and replace it with a number of young ones and that will add up to the same because that does not work. If you possibly can, please preserve your large trees, trimming is better than cutting down. Pollarding is the practice of removal of the upper branches of a tree with makes a dense head of growth. This is much better than cutting a tree down. Coppicing is cutting a tree to the ground where in future years new stems come up. This is what you see in woods around here where the wood of the trees was seen as a harvest and used for all sorts of things.

When you do any sort of cutting on trees in the garden you have logs of different shapes and sizes. This wood does not need to be removed from the garden. A log pile in the garden is a wonderful habitat for all sorts of wildlife, invertebrates of all sorts, particularly stag beetle larvae feed on decaying wood and they are endangered but also vertebrates such as slow worms, frogs, toads and wood mice which are a step up on the food chain and are preyed on in turn by badgers, foxes and birds of prey.

Thin twigs from pruning trees and shrubs are also useful in a heap woodsmen call brush and if you can find a quiet corner behind a shrub there will be a nice quiet city of wildlife to follow.

Although we think of the long life of a tree, sometimes one dies and unless it is dangerous some part of it could be left to rot in the ground and be home for another huge scope of life, liverworts, lichen, mosses, fungus and mould. It may be underneath a carpet of ivy perhaps. Life in your garden is wonderful in its infinite forms centred around trees.

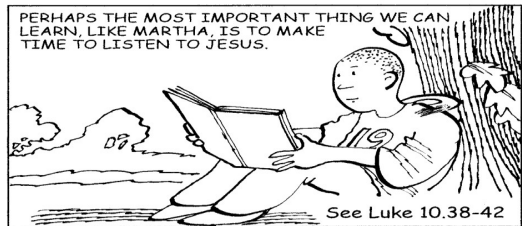
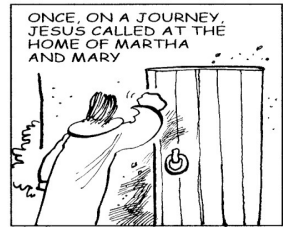
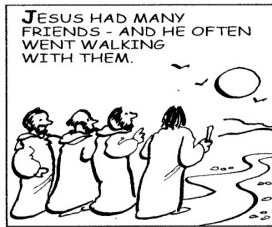
