John 3 verse 16

The Christian faith has an answer to this view, and it is this; the idea that life ends at death is a great deception. The reason why there is more to this life then a number of years then death, is because of what happened at the first Christmas in Bethlehem.

We are celebrating Christmas on 18th December at 2.00.p.m. in the St. John's Centre Meopham.


Members will be bringing readings, jokes, seasonal items, favourite music, a short Quiz maybe - anything to share and enjoy together.




North Kent Embroiderers

This month we enjoyed a bit of 'home tuition'. Our 'Four Corners' were led by members of the group. Sarah was leading the festive labels project with a variety of ideas to choose from. Veronica showed some of us how to work on canvas with perlé thread and Eve-





lyn taught another group the art of making 'Suffolk Puffs' also known as 'Yo-yos'. These are small, padded discs made from scraps of fabric and which can be used to make quilts and other decorative items. They are a very good way of using some of the 'stash' that all embroiderers seem to acquire. The technique goes back as far as the 1600s. The hall was noticeably quiet as we worked on our

tasks. The canvas work and festive labels were fun to do and as a tapestry needle was used there was no squinting at the tiny eye of a needle when trying to thread it!

In case you wondered, the fourth corner was to stitch and chat (working on your own project).

The postcard challenge continued this month following the theme of 'Trees' but with the added requirement to use chain stitch as part of the design. You can see one example here.

Winter frost

As we approach the shortest day of the year in December you will need work hard to keep warm outside, such as digging and tree pruning. Check your winter protection and if you have a greenhouse make sure the heater is working. Hopefully there are not too many jobs left to do this year so you will have time for some fireside garden planning.

Top 10 jobs this month

- I Check your winter protection structures are still securely in place
- 2 Check that greenhouse heaters are working
- 3 Insulate outdoor taps and prevent ponds from freezing
- 4 Prune open-grown apples and pears (not those trained against walls)
- 5 Prune acers, birches and vines before Christmas to avoid bleeding
- 6 Harvest leeks, parsnips, winter cabbage, sprouts/remaining root crops
- 7 Deciduous trees and shrubs can still be planted and transplanted
- 8 Take hardwood cuttings
- 9 Keep mice away from stored produce
- 10 Reduce watering of houseplants

After the judging, we were able to look a little more closely at some of the larger items; in particular, three magnificent patchwork quilts. All of the items on show, though, including those on the display table, were a credit to our W.l. and its members. In pride of place on the stage, was our magnificent centenary banner, displaying some exquisite embroidery skills by Kaye Wren. After all the excitement and jollity of the afternoon, we heard the very sad news about the passing of one of our much-loved former members, Ruth Vinall . Ruth was herself an extremely talented artist and a dear friend, who had generously donated commemorative mugs and other items for our centenary celebrations in 2019. Our sincere condolences go to Ruth's family and friends. A minute's silence was held for Ruth during our meeting.

Our next meeting, on Weds 3rd December, will be our 'Festive Tea', when we all get together to share food, tea, a bit of singing and a lot of fun and laughter. BELL RINGING by Peter Hartley

First to Tonbridge on a Rochester Cathedral Ringers' Outing. I was last in this large parish church 63 years ago on Skinners' Day, the annual Speech Day of Tonbridge School when, by tradition, the whole School and Governors, the Skinners Company, process to the church for a Service. The bells are still rung on Skinners' Day.

I now climbed the tower to ring their bells. The 8 bells (tenor 19cwt) were cast and installed in 1774 by Whitechapels and a peal was rung when the rector was the Reverend Baskerville. These bells have just been returned from the Loughborough Foundry having been restored and retuned. Now rehung the bells were a joy to ring going very smoothly with a rich and melodious sound. The about £70,000 cost was largely borne by one very generous church member. Gosh and thank you.

Following a fire the church in pretty hill village of Speldhurst was rebuilt in 1871 with a fine series of Morris & Co windows with designs by Burne-Jones. Up another tower this time to ring their 8 Victorian bells (tenor 13cwt) which were restored in the 1980's.

After lunch it was on via Frant and Lamberhurst for a final ring at Horsmonden Church which stands far outside its village. In 1944 a stray VI rocket, a "doodlebug", exploded near the church blowing out all the windows. The Marriott family had been the vicars for 160 years and the daughter of the last Marriott vicar designed the new colourful east and west windows which were installed in 1946 and 1948.

The 8 bells (tenor 17cwt) were cast in the 1770's. Then in 1925 they were retuned and rehung on a metal frame by Gillett & Johnson of Croydon. The ringing room has a low ceiling so each fluffy colourful woollen sally disappears up through its hole in the ceiling at every backstroke to reappear at every handstroke.

On a board on the ringing room wall were listed the names of all 20 Lambert dynasty who rang between 1799 and 1979. They were fine ringers for an 1896 peal board records the ringing of 720 changes of Double Stedman Slow by 4 Lamberts and 2 relations.

It had been an enjoyable day and the ringing had included the staple methods of Plain Bob, Grandshire, Stedman and Cambridge. After 5 towers I was ready to rest my legs as Storm Amy blew away.

A Happy Christmas to all from all bell ringers.
