#### Bell Ringing by Peter Hartley

Probably Christmas Day starts a little later and more calmly in my corner of Cobham College than in many homes in Cobham with younger family members. But start it did and as I tucked into a slice of Melton Mowbray pork pie for breakfast, as Hartley family tradition dictates, I listened to the early Morning Service broadcast on the radio from Bath Abbey. The Service began with the 10 Abbey bells ringing out: Christmas and bells go together, along with pork pie, turkey, brussel sprouts, stilton cheese, tangerines and absolutely everything else. Gosh there are 9 ringing towers in Bath; Christmas must be magical.

In Cobham I hope we wove our own Christmas morning magic for we were a full team of 6 ringers to ring our 6 bells as they have rung out on Christmas Day for nigh on four hundred years.

Now Big Ben, atop the magnificently restored Elizabeth Tower, has struck twelve and a New Year has begun. Big Ben is the hour bell of the Westminster chimes. It was first cast by Warners of Stockton-on-Tees in 1856 and travelled by sea to the Pool of London. The 16 ton bell came across Westminster Bridge on a dray drawn by sixteen white horses.

The bell was mounted on a gallows and tested for most of 1857 when it developed a crack. Whitechapel Bell Foundry agreed to recast the bell in 1858 and the slightly lighter bell was hauled up the tower in October. Finally Big Ben boomed out the hours on 11<sup>th</sup> July 1859. But in September the bell again cracked. Furious controversy raged for three years. Eventually the bell was given a quarter turn and the weight of the clapper reduced. In 1862 Big Ben, with crack, sounded again.

On New Year's Eve 1923, with a line connected to the BBC studios in Savoy Hill, just off the Strand, Big Ben first broadcast worldwide and remains the most famous bell in the world. It is the beating heart of our national life and Big Ben tolled every minute for the State Funeral Processions of Queen Elizabeth II.

In this new month of January in this new year of 2023 we hope to ring on the evening of the 25<sup>th</sup> when the new Bishop of Rochester will be here for a Service to welcome our new Priests as they take up their time honoured duties of enhancing worship, fostering the life of our parishes of Cobham and Luddesdowne with Dode and being good shepherds to all who live here.

The bells constantly change their ringing order and 2023 continues to unfold.

#### February - Spring is in sight

This month there are signs of the approaching spring, with bulbs appearing and wildlife waking up as light levels and temperatures increase. There's plenty to do indoors this month to prepare for the season ahead. Outdoors, as the garden comes to life again, it's time to prune shrubs and climbers, such as Wisteria as well as evergreen hedges.

#### RHS – Top 10 Jobs this month

- I Prepare vegetable seed beds, and sow some vegetables under cover
- 2 Chit potato tubers
- 3 Protect blossom on apricots, nectarines and peaches
- 4 Net fruit and vegetable crops to keep the birds off
- 5 Prune winter-flowering shrubs that have finished flowering
- 6 Divide bulbs such as snowdrops & plant those that need planting 'in the green'
- 7 Prune Wisteria
- 8 Prune hardy evergreen hedges & renovate overgrown deciduous hedges
- 9 Prune conservatory climbers such as bougainvillea

10 Cut back deciduous grasses left uncut over the winter, remove dead grass from evergreen grasses

#### **Gardening for a Wilder Kent** Cutting down on Chemicals

We are exploring and spreading the word of how we can all make a difference to the wildlife in Kent. Last month ponds were our focus and this month our focus is the resolution we can all make to stop using chemical poisons in our gardens.

Pesticides and other harmful chemicals are designed to kill a wide range of organisms including insects and plants. Weed killers and insecticides are freely available to buy but they harm insects and destroy the habitat they rely upon. Growing without harmful chemicals takes a bit more thought and planning, but by harnessing nature's natural defences a happy balance between predator and prey can be found.

Healthy growing works on the principle of prevention, rather than cure. Always maintain a healthy, active soil with plenty of nutrients, using compost and manures. Crop rotation helps to prevent diseases from building up in the soil so vary where you plant your vegetables year after year. Growing flowers with vegetables attracts beneficial wildlife, such as caterpillar-eating birds and aphid-eating insects. Using toxic chemicals kills not only the pest, but creates health hazards for the beneficial wildlife that play a part in controlling the pests in your garden. Choose plants and varieties that are suited to the site and soil as they will have a better chance of being strong enough to fight off pests and diseases. Finally, be vigilant, keep out pests, such as slugs, caterpillars and pigeons, by constantly checking your barriers, traps and covers. Especially after rain or in damp conditions. Remember we need caterpillars to have butterflies!

TOP TIPS • Plant the right thing in the right place. A plant grown in the wrong conditions will be stressed and more likely to succumb to unwelcome garden insects or disease. Choose plants suited to the site and the soil. • Keep your soil healthy and well fed with peat-free compost, green manure and/or natural fertilisers. Good soil is full of worms and other life that make the nutrients available to support healthy plants. Wildflowers, however, thrive in nutrient-poor soils, so make sure you leave a patch of unfertilised soil. • Mix your planting. Growing flowers amongst your veg or locating a weed patch nearby will attract beneficial insects, such as hover-flies, lacewings and ladybirds. These will act as predators on sap-sucking aphids. • Create barriers. A barrier of coarse bark or sharp gravel around veg or flower beds helps deter slugs and snails. If you have raised beds, try running some copper wire around the sides to form a ring. • Be vigilant! To keep out slugs and snails, keep checking your barriers, traps and covers, especially after rain or in damp conditions.

#### **GOD IN THE ARTS**

At the end of this month we enter the season of Lent: those 40 days when we follow Jesus into the Wilderness and prepare ourselves to celebrate His Easter victory.

In the last century an artist called Stanley Spencer planned to create a series of 40 paintings,



each depicting a day in the wilderness. In the end he completed nine, one of which is this painting from 1939: '

Christ in the Wilderness – Scorpions.' It is held in a private collection. Stanley Spencer lived and worked in the village of Cookham in Berkshire. The village and the local countryside were the setting for many of his paintings, and the village's inhabitants his models. Through their everyday life he was trying to glimpse and convey the transcendent. 'Angels and dirt' he called it: the divine seen in the ordinary. So, in a painting of Christ carrying His cross, Jesus has the face of the local grocer. Another villager modelled for this Jesus in the wilderness: a strong, hefty, broad figure. This is a great contrast to the Christ of stained-glass windows who often seems too good to be part of our world. Here is real life: a large man filling the canvas with His head, His hands and His feet. This figure of Jesus comes as a shock: a very human model, ordinary with nothing handsome or special about Him, apart from His tunic which seems to sprawl and undulate like the hills around. Here is a Jesus born into this world and one with this world.

There are two focal points in the painting – the neat, little scorpion and the massive, unkempt head contemplating each other. One is life in all its hefty reality; the other a tiny creature able to squeeze that life out by one swift flick of its tail.

Jesus is shown in the wilderness pondering the life and ministry called of Him by God - a life and ministry that will take Him from the countryside into the towns and villages and take Him also to the death of Good Friday. Will He find the strength and renewal to embrace that ministry during His time in the desert?

During Lent as we follow Jesus, we seek to live for God. That may mean dying to all that separates us from God. He has a ministry, a calling for each of us. As we contemplate that calling in this season of Lent, we may find it is a calling that leads us through these 40 days to life and Easter life – we may find it a journey that calls us to die to self to find our God.

#### Wordsearch Clues and Answers for February 2023

In New Testament times 40 days old was an important age for a baby boy: it was when they made their first 'public appearance'. Mary, like all good Jewish mothers, went to the Temple with Jesus, her first male child - to 'present him to the Lord'. At the same time, she, as a new mother, was 'purified'. Thus, we have the Festival of the Presentation of Christ in the Temple, 40 days after Christmas. Jesus is described in the Bible as the Light of the World, and so early Christians developed the tradition of lighting many candles in celebration of this day. The Church also fell into the custom of blessing the year's supply of candles for the church on this day - hence the name, Candlemas. The story can be found in Luke 2:22-40, where Simeon makes his great declaration of faith and recognition of Jesus. Simeon's 'Nunc Dimittis', is embedded in the Office of Evening Prayer.
