Letter from the Rev'd Pam Davies

Dear Friends

Are you listening to me? It's a familiar question. In most of our conversations we listen to the other person, up to a point anyway. Sometimes we only half listen, and sometimes we are mainly thinking about what we want to say. Sometimes we get distracted, but sometimes we really never listen at all, especially to those we think we know very well. Then we can be in trouble.

There is also a kind of blessing which is really careful and attentive listening ready to encourage the speaker to say more, not assuming we already know what they mean, not filling in the blanks not just relating what we hear too quickly to our own experience. Such listening will help the other to say more, and to learn more about what they think and feel as well. Listening like this is a gift and a skill, but all of us can do more to listen to one another.

Listening is also crucial to learning and understanding. The ones that find it most difficult to listen are those who already know everything! I'm sure we all know someone like that - it's never ourselves of course. Sometimes we find it difficult to learn, not because we don't listen, but because we're not interested and we think the subject is pointless and irrelevant.

Listening to God is not altogether unlike listening to other people. It requires our time and attention and there are also skills to be learned. There are various reasons why listening to God can seem difficult (or impossible). We may not think it is possible to hear what God says because he is not there, or because there is no reliable way of knowing what he says.

Perhaps we don't want to hear what God says, fearful that it will in some way threaten or challenge our own well-being. All these issues clearly have to be tackled before we can hear what God says. You may even be asking is there a God anyway.

Perhaps you have questions about listening or talking to God And you've never had the opportunity to ask these questions or even better to listen to the answers. Well! I'm offering you an opportunity to come along and ask your questions. From the 11th March to the 8th April you are invited to join me each Tuesday afternoon at 1.30 for an hour at St Marys Church Room, Sole Street. If afternoons are difficult then why not join me in the evening at the Vicarage Battle Street Cobham from 7.30 on the same Tuesdays.

No question is too little or too big to be asked. Some questions may be easy to answer while others are more difficult. But this is an invitation and an opportunity to find out what all this faith business, church business and God business is all about.

Looking forward to seeing you and listening to the questions you wish to ask.

Refurbishment and New Extension to St Mary's Church Room, Sole Street

I am pleased to inform everyone that the completion to the refurbishment and provision of an additional extension to the St Mary's Church Room in Sole Street is very near.

Much of the interior work and the new extension is now completed. The new roof is in place, the old school bell has been rehung and the repaired stained glass windows are in place, though covered at present for protection. The new sympathetic windows have been fitted and inside the old stage removed and extensive repairs have been made to the flooring. At the time of writing, mid-January, much of the remaining work including the erection of disabled ramps and cladding to the sides of the building is external and thus weather related. However, it is hoped that by the time you read this report the refurbishment should be completed and we have a provisional hand over date of 2nd February 2025, (also dependent on weather).

Following hand over, items have to be brought back from storage and cleaned, so realistically, the hall may be available for use by user groups from March, if the Committee and post holders are in place and can be appointed by that time. It is hoped to hold a special Open Day for village residents and other supporters of the project, but at the time of this magazine going to press, these details have not been finalised. (Further details next month).

On behalf of the St Mary Magdalene PCC Cobham, I would like to thank all who have donated to the project. Special thanks are due to the Local Funding Group for their efforts and to all the many individuals who have made sizeable donations. I also wish to record our gratitude to the Lower Thames Crossing and all the other grant giving bodies for their generosity. A complete list of these donations will be given in a future Newsletter.

BELL RINGING by Peter Hartley

A useful proposition by Kenneth Graham in "The Wind in the Willows" is worth observing at this time of the year. "No animal", he writes, "according to the rules of animal-etiquette, is ever expected to do anything strenuous, or heroic, or even moderately active during the off-season of winter".

From my snug College burrow I recall a November ringing trip where at Wrotham we rang the 8 bells recast in 1911 to mark King George V's Coronation. With a 20cwt tenor bell they make a grand sound. There is a vaulted passage through the base of the tower which allows an excellent path for disabled access.

Ringing at Ightham there was a chance to look into St. Catherine's Chapel and see the memorials to two soldiers awarded the Victoria Cross. William Sutton, a bugler in The Rifles, won his Victoria Cross in 1857 in the Indian Mutiny. However he was to die in the workhouse. Thomas Colyer-Fergusson won his postumous V.C. in 1917. His family were of Wombwell Hall, Northfleet and Ightham Mote and family trust funds helped towards the restoration of our Cobham bells in 1994.

The estate church at Shipbourne was built in 1881 by the Cazalets of Fair-lawne on the site of a previous chapel. Peter Cazalet was the trainer of horses owned by Queen Elizabeth The Queen Mother. The tower was encased in scaffolding for some restoration work. But we were able to ring the 6 bells once we had ducked under a scaffolding pole in the ringing room.

The church at Hadlow stands in the shadow of the tall and slender 1838 tower of Hadlow Castle. There has been a church here since Saxon times. We rang the eight (1695 and 1775) bells. In the last forty years much reordering has provided the building with modern facilities for worship and community use and organ recitals are enjoyed. The amazing 1880 organ by Thomas Monk with three manuals and over 2,000 pipes, one of which is 32 ft., was the gift of the Reverend James Moneypenny. John Vane, 7th Earl of Westmorland, demolished Mereworth's castle, church and village between 1722 and 1744 and built in a style to commemorate his Grand Tour. In the Kentish countryside Mereworth Church is amazing and looks as if it has come straight from the City of London. Having rung the six bells we emerged into the darkening November day. Time to hunker down. Spring is coming.

Rome bracing to welcome 60 million visitors this year
















A short story from the Bible
