

People are coming to faith amidst the 'darkness' of crises around the world. So says several Church of England bishops. They believe that increasing numbers of people have been turning to the Christian faith.

The Bishop of Rochester, Jonathan Gibbs said: "Something is going on. Or rather, God Himself seems to be up to something – way beyond what we as Christians have been doing to share the message of the gospel with the people around us.

"Humanly speaking, I believe this is happening because people have begun to realise that the things in which they had placed their hopes – things like ever-increasing prosperity or the ability of science and technology to solve all our problems – have started to crumble in the face of economic crises, global pandemics and climate change."

The Bishop of Gloucester, Rachel Treweek said: "As I have listened to the voices of children, young people and adults across this diocese; the voices in Westminster, and indeed in prisons; I believe there is a yearning for certainty amid the turbulence, anxiety and uncertainty, and the endless messaging of crises."

The Bishop of Chichester, Martin Warner, speaks of joyful celebrations of baptisms and confirmations in his Diocese and new congregation members at Chichester Cathedral.

"A new generation attending Chichester Cathedral have shifted the atmosphere," he said. "Buggies now take their place alongside the Zimmer frames, to the delight of everyone."


RHS – Top 10 Jobs for February

1. Prepare vegetable seed beds, and sow some vegetables under cover
2. Chit potato tubers
3. Protect blossom on apricots, nectarines, and peaches
4. Net fruit and vegetable crops to keep the birds off
5. Prune winter-flowering shrubs that have finished flowering
6. Divide bulbs such as snowdrops, and plant those that need planting 'in the green'
7. Prune Wisteria
8. Prune hardy evergreen hedges & renovate overgrown deciduous hedges
9. Prune conservatory climbers such as bougainvillea
10. Cut back deciduous grasses left uncut over the winter, remove dead grass from evergreen grasses

North Kent Embroiderers



Shrove Tuesday – Pancake Day – 17th February

It's odd, really, to think that that confessing one's sins to God should be linked to making pancakes. And yet the beginning of Lent brings us both – Shrove Tuesday is Pancake Day, and is followed by Ash Wednesday, and so Lent begins.

In centuries gone by, the pancakes were made to use up the milk and eggs before the fasting of Lent. More recently, many readers will have childhood memories of the wonder of watching our mothers break an egg, mix it with milk and flour – and out of that gooey mess, to produce a light and delicious pancake.

These days, more of us buy pancake mix, or even ready-made pancakes. It seems we prefer the certainty of ending up with pancakes - to the risk of having made nothing BUT a mess of the kitchen.

In many parishes they used to hold pancake races on the day. Why anyone would want to run around a field while holding a pancake is not clear, but in Olney, Bucks, they have held a pancake race almost every year since 1445.





BELL RINGING by Peter Hartley

We rang on Christmas morning to share in the joy of Christmas Day. This ringer when ringing an unseen bell high above him often thinks that bell must have rung through the decades and often the centuries for many great occasions and also happy and sad moments. Not forgetting the transitory ringers who gave the bells their voices and are now forgotten.

Bells are a part of a place and its history. Rory Stewart was Member of Parliament for Penrith and the Border and too intelligent and interesting to stay in today's House of Commons nor understandably prepared to serve under fellow Etonian Boris Johnson. He knew his constituents and the unique history of Britain's lost middle land either side of the border between the Kingdoms of Scotland and England. He wrote and broadcast about the turbulent history of these border lands or debateable lands where reivers, with violence, rustled cattle and sheep across the disputed border.

Mediaeval Carlisle Cathedral, at the western end of the border, lost its 4 original bells in a storm in the late 1300s when the tower blew down. These bells had been chimed when, in the presence of King Edward I (1272 – 1307), the Papal Legate had solemnly cursed Robert the Bruce (King Robert I of Scotland 1306 – 1329). In the Civil War the Scottish Presbyterian Army demolished much of the Cathedral nave using the stone to reinforce Carlisle castle. In the Commonwealth period 6 chiming bells were put in order and these bells were sounded in 1745 when 'Bonnie Prince Charlie' the Young Pretender and his Jacobite army entered the city. But the Duke of Cumberland retook the city three weeks later and ordered the bells to be silenced for 100 years.

In 1897 Queen Victoria enquired of the Dean if the Hanoverian embargo was the cause of the cathedral bells being silent during her Diamond Jubilee. Only in 1925 did the Whitechapel foundry restore the existing bells and add two more making a ring of eight. But 8 bells cast by 5 different founders and dating between the 15th and 20th century resulted in the 'worst Cathedral bells in England'.

At the Millennium, with a Millennium grant and other monies, Taylor's of Loughborough cast 10 new bells with another 2 being added in 2005. Now this second smallest cathedral in England has the best cathedral bells in the Country say the Carlisle Cathedral band of ringers perhaps ending all disputes in the debateable lands.






The Presentation of Christ in the Temple/ Candlemas

Candlemas, 2nd February, comes exactly 40 days after Christmas. In New Testament times 40 days old was an important age for a baby boy: it was when they made their first 'public appearance'. Mary, like all good Jewish mothers, went to the Temple with Jesus, her first male child - to 'present Him to the Lord'. Thus, we have the Festival of the Presentation of Christ in the Temple (Luke 2: 22-40). So where does the Candlemas bit come in?
