St Mary's Church Room, Sole Street

It was a great joy, honour and privilege to be able to come together on Sunday II May to thank God and others for all the work, offering of skills, resources and finances that meant we could re-open the Church Room after extensive refurbishment. Present on that morning were those who have been raising funds, regular congregation members, members of the Parish Council, residents, members of the Baker family and the Bishop of Rochester, Dr Jonathan Gibbs.

In his sermon, at the service of thanksgiving and dedication, Bishop Jonathan noted that like the re-building of the Temple in Jerusalem after the Jewish exile in Babylon referred to in the Old Testament reading from the Book of Haggai, the refurbishment of the Church Room was a symbol of people's willingness to put the worship of God and the well-being of their community over their own private comfort and well-being. Their willingness to do this was really important at a time when people were beginning to look once again for connection with others and with God, looking for purpose and meaning and for guidance and for security in an uncertain world.

The refurbishment of the Church Room has come at just the right time to provide the community in Sole Street and Cobham with the opportunity to connect with others and with God through the life of the Church and through the sharing of the Gospel.

Reflecting on the words of Jesus in John's Gospel,

'My sheep hear my voice. I know them and they follow me' (John 10 v 27), Bishop Jonathan went on to say that the key task of the Christian Church is to help people to discover that Jesus is the person through whom we can hear the voice of God and enter into a loving relationship with him as the Good Shepherd who knows the sheep of his flock and is known by them.

Church buildings are important, just as the Temple was important for the people of Israel, but the place where we meet with God is through a person, the person of Jesus, and what is really important about the refurbished Church Room is the new opportunity it provides for helping people to meet with God through him.

Bishop Jonathan finished by saying that his prayer was that St Mary's Church Room would be a place of connection, a place where people would build relationships with one another and with the living God through his Son Jesus Christ.

On Sunday 11th May, as the bright sunlight shone through the newly restored stained glass windows, The Bishop of Rochester, The Rt. Revd Dr Jonathan Gibbs, assisted by The Revd Canon Alyson Davie, our Priest in Charge, conducted a Service of Thanksgiving and Dedication at the St Mary's Church Room, following the recent completion of the refurbishment project.

Happily, the congregation of about 40 people was joined by representatives of the Baker Family, it was Sir Herbert Baker that had given the land for the original construction in the 1880s.

Following the Service everyone celebrated with tea and coffee in The Railway Inn, thanks to the kindness of Dave the landlord. The Church Room is now fully open and available for hire by local groups and individuals at a rate of £12.00 an hour, with a reduction for regular or group use, out of area users pay £15.00 an hour. 

June - Summer arrives.

June 21st is the longest day of the year, and the extra light and warmth encourages the garden to put on an exuberant burst of growth. But this extra light and warmth also means weeds will sprout up from seemingly nowhere. Keep on top of them by hoeing regularly in dry conditions. Here's the RHS Top 10 Jobs for this month.

- I Hoe borders regularly to keep down weeds.
- 2 Be water-wise, especially in drought-affected areas.
- 3 Pinch out sideshoots on tomatoes.
- 4 Harvest lettuce, radish, other salads, and early potatoes
- 5 Position summer hanging baskets and containers outside
- 6 Mow lawns at least once a week
- 7 Plant out summer bedding
- 8 Stake tall or floppy plants
- 9 Prune many spring-flowering shrubs.
- 10 Shade greenhouses to keep them cool and prevent scorch





CHURCH NEWS

Church grants scheme launched to kick start housing plans

Churches hoping to build affordable homes for their communities on pockets of land they own – or as part of schemes such as rebuilding parish halls– have been invited to apply for grants to pay for expert advice from a new $\pounds 3.2$ million fund.

Funding of up to \pounds 25,000 towards the cost of architect, consultant and other professional fees is available through the Church of England scheme.

The national initiative aims to help parishes and dioceses work towards achieving the goals set out in the *Coming Home* report, from the Archbishops' Commission on Housing, Church and Community. The landmark study called on the Church of England to lead by example in working to solve the housing crisis.

BELL RINGING by Peter Hartley

Leafing through a copy of the bell ringers magazine "The Ringing World" I enjoyed an imagined biography of Lord Peter Wimsey. Lord Peter was a son of the Duke of Denver, an old Etonian, talented cricketer, private detective and the creation of the writer Dorothy L. Sayers in the golden age of crime fiction. He was also a bell ringer who memorably rang a long peal in Norfolk at Fenchurch St. Paul in the story "The Nine Tailors".

In today's world the real life story of local boy Henry Nolloth does seem like fiction. Born in Bexleyheath in 1846 he graduated from Oxford and was ordained in Rochester Cathedral in 1869. He held curacies at Luton, suburb of Chatham, and in Plumstead. In 1880 he was appointed Vicar of Beverley Minster in the East Riding of Yorkshire where he served for 41 years. There he led and largely financed a major project to beautify the Minster installing new stained glass windows, adding statues to empty niches in the fabric, building a new organ case and installing railings round the churchyard.

With an enthusiasm for bells Canon Nolloth and his wife Marion commissioned Taylors of Loughborough to cast a ring of 10 bells (tenor 34 cwt) for St. Mary's, Beverley and an improved ring of 10 bells (tenor 41 cwt) for Beverley Minster. Amazingly they then financed a huge (9th largest in England today) 7 ton bourdon bell, also from Taylors, which was hung in the Minster's south-west tower.

As Canon Nolloth admitted 'bells are a hobby of mine'. He was also an inspirational preacher whose sermons drew up to 800 worshippers. The story is told of some of those listening who 'were perhaps amusedly counting the number of times he used the phrase "and lastly", which punctuated the last quarter of many an address.' (Sounds familiar). He died in 1929.

I fondly remember a more recent though now distant time as times continue to change. Much of bell ringing does not change as we continue to ring the changes.

The future of the Friends of Cobham Church

The Friends will be holding their Annual General Meeting on 22 June. 5 of the current trustees, including the Chairman, Treasurer and Secretary have said that they are not prepared to serve another year, so the Council have reluctantly decided that if no replacements – preferably younger than the retirees! - are forthcoming at the AGM the Friends will have to be wound up.

The FOCC was founded 45 years ago, with the aim of involving the wider community in helping to maintain the fabric of the village church. They have since provided funds for numerous projects including major repairs to the stained glass, the restoration of the church bells, connecting the church to main drainage and refitting the church kitchen. With the continuing decline in active church membership this support has become ever more necessary.




Book Reviews


Dear friends
