Hello Everyone,

Recently we had a very interesting Zoom talk and demonstration from Zara Day who is the founder and Creative Director of Rosemaryrose Bespoke Embroidered Textiles. Her company specialises in the embellishment of fabrics for luxury residential and commercial properties. You can see some examples of her work here. Zara worked for several printed textile companies before training as a teacher and subsequently teaching for sixteen years. She told us of her journey to the present day and how she constantly considers the environment in her decisions. During lockdown Zara also set up and taught live online embroidery courses which several of our members have enjoyed taking part in.

After the talk, Zara gave us a demonstration of some creative embroidery techniques. It was sur-

prising to see just what a great effect we could get with just a few simple stitches such as back stitch, seeding, split stitch, stem stitch, couching, french knots, herringbone stitch etc, plus a variety of threads. We had come prepared with fabric, designs and threads so that our members were able to stitch along with Zara. Of course the piece wasn't finished on the day but we had had enough tuition and inspiration to finish it off in our own time. It was lovely to see so many of us enjoying our online lesson together and producing beautiful things.

Our next meeting is planned to be 'live' which is a very exciting thought. We have been asked to bring along the work we have done during lockdown and that includes our Covid challenge 'NKEG in spite of Covid-19 we continue to stitch'. Of course we are now NKE not NKEG, but that just shows how long it is since we met together in person.

October - The autumn chill sets in

Although we had some warmer days over September, the autumn is now definitely here for real, and it feels colder. It's a beautiful time of year, with the trees changing colour. Sometimes it may seem pointless raking, when the wind blows even more leaves onto the lawn, but just think of all the lovely leaf mould you can make! It's also time to start preparing for early frosts.

RHS - Top 10 jobs this month

- I Divide established rhubarb crowns to create new plants
- 2 Cut back perennials that have died down
- 3 Divide herbaceous perennials
- 4 Move tender plants, including aquatic ones, into a greenhouse or conservatory
- 5 Plant out spring cabbages
- 6 Harvest apples, pears, grapes and nuts
- 7 Prune climbing rose
- 8 Finish collecting seeds from the garden to sow next year
- 9 Last chance to mow lawns and trim hedges in mild areas
- 10 Renovate old lawns or create new grass areas by laying turf

This year marks the centenary of Cobham War Memorial.
