Hello everyone,

This month we were treated to a Zoom talk by Sara Cook www.bojagiuk.com entitled "Bojagi: Korean Textiles" We are all getting used to zooming now and there was a good turn out from our members.



Sara has sewn from an early age and originally trained as a theatre costume designer. She has visited Korea and worked with leading Bojagi artists there. Sara also teaches the skill to others and has written a book on the subject.

Bojagi textiles are pieces of cloth stitched together and often embroidered to make wrappings or coverings. The wraps were for functional or domestic items, usually square and used by rich and poor alike. You can


see these two pieces done using silk organza and showing triple stitched seams. The 'Summer Glow' wall hanging on the left shows little tiny pine nut decorations on the edges which are supposed to bring good luck, whilst the other piece has 'bakjwi' – knots in the shape of bats. Photo-



graphs were taken by Michael Wicks. Bojagi supports the Confucion idea that to make something beautiful out of scraps is a good thing. Sara's talk gave us a fascinating insight into some of the customs and traditions of a Korean woman. She told us how new brides would be expected

tions of a Korean woman. She told us how new brides would be expected to make one hundred thimbles to give to the women in their new family, they would then be responsible for all the sewing in the house. The thimbles would be made from cotton fabric lined with mulberry paper and glued together to stop the needle going through. The young woman's stitches had to be even because "even stitches mean an even temper which makes for a good life".

After Sara's very interesting talk we had time for some discussion and chat.

September - Late summer progresses into autumn

It's also time to get out and start planting spring-flowering bulbs for next year and you can collect seeds for next summer's colour too. Make the most of the remaining warmth while you can!

RHS - Top 10 jobs this month

- I Divide herbaceous perennials
- 2 Pick autumn raspberries
- 3 Collect and sow seed from perennials and hardy annuals
- 4 Dig up remaining potatoes before slug damage spoils them
- 5 Net ponds before leaf fall gets underway
- 6 Keep up with watering of new plants, using rain or grey water if possible
- 7 Start to reduce the frequency of houseplant watering
- 8 Clean out cold frames and greenhouses so that they are ready for use in the autumn
- 9 Cover leafy vegetable crops with bird-proof netting
- 10 Plant spring flowering bulbs





The Parable of the Weeds (Matthew 13.24-30)
