


Harvest Thanksgiving with Four Churches

The joint Harvest service involving congregations and community members from Cobham, Luddesdowne, Meopham and Nurstead held at St John's Church, Meopham on 28 September was a lively event focussed on thanking and blessing farmers near and far.

68kg of donated perishable foods was subsequently distributed to Gravesham Foodbank and a further 28kg to West Kingsdown Community Stores. In addition a substantial quantity of fresh produce was given to the Ellenor Hospice in Gravesend.

We also raised £309.72 in cash and card donations to go to Rochester Diocese Poverty and Hope Appeal projects around the world. The majority of these involve supporting farming communities affected by climate change in Africa and Latin America. As much of the cash donations were gift-aided, an additional £52.50 can be reclaimed from HMRC, to give a total raised of £362.22

Thanks very much to everyone involved for your help in sharing God's blessings around the world.

North Kent Embroiderers

At our last meeting members welcomed Elitta Fell www.mouseline.co.uk to speak to us. Elitta is a silk painter and watercolourist, who was formerly a graphic designer, but who explored various crafts—including mosaics and rag rug making—before discovering silk painting, which marked the start of a new chapter in her career.

As an introduction to her talk, Elitta gave us a brief history of silk making. Archaeologists have found silk thread and spinning tools that are between six thousand and seven thousand years old, with China claiming to be the first to use silk threads. The silkworms from where the silk comes, feed exclusively on leaves from the white-berried mulberry tree. China kept silk production secret for two thousand years, until the process eventually began in Japan. The ancient Silk Road opened up the highly profitable silk trade with Europe.

Each silkworm produces one thousand yards of continuous thread, but sadly in commercial production the cocoon is boiled in the process of unwinding the thread. If, as in the wild, the grub is allowed to eat its way out of the silk cocoon, then the short lengths of silk thread have to be joined to make a continuous length. The resulting woven fabric is less smooth. Scientists have long tried to copy the beauty of woven silk and have even made a silk like product using spider's webs and also from (genetically modified) goat's milk.

Elitta mainly uses chiffon weight silk material as it allows the dyes to be absorbed fully on both the back and front of the material. There are two kinds of products which Elitta uses in silk painting. Gutta is used to make outlines of her design on the silk and dyes are then added. The gutta prevents the colours from merging. Coloured gutta remains on the material, but clear gutta can be removed to leave an empty white line as part of the design. To set the paint, heat is needed. There are a variety of methods, including steaming, using a hairdryer or an iron.

Elitta told us about the various finishes that can be applied to the wet dye e.g. salt will absorb some of the colour and create less dark areas, giving a mottled effect. Alcohol drops will remove the colour altogether. One method is to mix water and vinegar, drop on to the dye, then wrap the silk over your hand to secure some folds before putting the bundle (without your hand!) into the microwave. This creates a tie dye effect.

Japanese shibori is another technique Elitta uses to make her designs. Silk can be wrapped around wood or folded tightly and clamped before dyeing. To make silk pictures, a lightweight iron on Vilene is used to back the silk.

Elitta had brought some beautiful examples of her work for us to see.

November

Winter is on its way but there is still plenty to do in the garden. Leaves are falling rapidly, and wind and rain are on the increase. Tender plants will need protecting from frost, gales and freezing rains. Move plants into the greenhouse, or into a sheltered spot, but if you can't, it is worth wrapping plants or pots in situ. Remember winter can be a tough time for birds in terms of water and food, so keep supplies well topped up.

RHS - Top Jobs this month

- 1. Clear up fallen leaves especially from lawns, ponds and beds
- 2. Raise containers onto pot feet to prevent waterlogging
- 3. Plant tulip bulbs for a spring display next year
- 4. Prune roses to prevent wind-rock
- 5. Plant out winter bedding
- 6. Cover brassicas with netting if pigeons are a problem
- 7. Insulate outdoor containers from frost bubble wrap works well
- 8. Stop winter moth damage to fruit trees using grease bands around the trunks
- 9. Put out bird food to encourage winter birds into the garden

BELL RINGING by Peter Hartley

The little Victorian church at Hatfield Heath, Essex was built in 1859 and its 3 bells, cast by the Whitechapel bell foundry, were installed in the year of Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee of 1897. In 1961 the three bells were melted down to produce a very light ring of 6 bells (tenor 4cwt). The bells are rung inside the south porch so I assume the congregation have to walk round to the north door to enter the church for a service. A celebratory peal was rung in 1961 and I noted from the peal board that in the band of ringers were a Mr. Curzon and a Mr. Rochester.

The ringing room in the Tudor tower at Sawbridgeworth had pinned on the outside of its door a notice reading 'Heavy Metal, nearly 5 tons'. The ring of bells was augmented to 8 in 1870 and the tenor weighs 24cwt. I also rang here eighteen years ago and admired the memorials in the church and enjoyed the swifts racing between the chimney pots. This time the church was locked and the swifts were gone. We last saw our swifts at Cobham many years ago.

Harlow continues to change. Originally in the Diocese of London it was handed over to Rochester in 1848, transferred to the new Diocese of St. Albans in 1877 and to Chelmsford in 1914. St. Mary's, Old Harlow is medieval but suffered a severe fire in 1708. A major restoration was completed in 1873. The central tower was entirely rebuilt to look like a 15th century tower topped by a 13th century spire. The ring of 8 bells (tenor 21cwt) were the gift of a Mr. Walford of Bocking in memory of his wife Emily and were cast by Warner of Cripplegate in 1883.

Having enjoyed the final ring of the day it was time to leave St. Mary's with its ministry team, numerous parochial church councillors and drum kit in the chancel and skirt past Harlow New Town onto the MII by way of the new Harlow junction 7A. Back at Cobham where, with a mug of soup, I watched a recording of the day's Trooping of the Colour

I know that some of you will be getting excited about Bonfire night and I am sure your big people will be very careful when you are watching and enjoying the fireworks; keeping you at a safe distance and following the safety rules for using sparklers. Of course you understand that only adults should deal with firework displays and the lighting of fireworks.

Here are some guidelines to make sure everyone has have a fun time.

- 1. Plan your firework display to make it safe and enjoyable.
- 2. Keep fireworks in a closed box and use them one at a time.
- 3. Read /follow the instructions on each firework, using a torch if needed.
- 4. Light the firework at arm's length with a taper, and stand well back.
- 5. Keep naked flames, away from fireworks.
- 6. Never return to a firework once it has been lit.
- 7. Don't put fireworks in pockets and never throw them.
- 8. Direct any rocket fireworks well away from spectators.
- 9. Never use paraffin or petrol on a bonfire.
- 10. Make sure that the fire is out and surroundings are made safe before leaving.



St Andrew is the patron saint of Scotland, though his only connection with the country is that some of his bones were reputedly transported in the 8th century to Fife and preserved at a church in a place now named St Andrews.

Andrew was one of the first disciples of Jesus, and the very first to bring someone else to Christ - his own brother. Like many fervent Jews at the time Andrew and an unnamed companion had been drawn to the prophet John the Baptist. When one day John pointed out Jesus to Andrew and his friend, and described him as the 'Lamb of God', the two young men assumed that the next stage of their spiritual search was about to unfold. So as Jesus made off, they followed him.

When Jesus turned and asked them what they were 'seeking', all they could come up with was a lame enquiry about his current place of residence: 'where are you staying?'

The reply of Jesus was the most straight-forward invitation anyone can receive: 'Come and see'. So they did, and the results of their response were life changing. For Andrew brought his brother, Peter, to Jesus, and soon the little apostolic band who would carry the message of Jesus to the whole world was formed. And right at the front of the column, as it were, was Andrew, the first disciple of Jesus.
